Pollution Control Requirements

Construction sites must minimize the amount of dirt and other pollutants that enter storm sewers, ditches and waterbodies.

- ◆ Do not litter
- ◆ Do not track mud from the site
- ◆ Do not damage erosion and sediment controls
- ◆ Handle wash water appropriately
- ◆ Clean up spills before they enter storm sewers, ditches or waterbodies

Employee Education

- Remind workers:
 - Watch BMPs
 - Watch the weather
 - Know when deliveries are being made
 - Potential tracking
 - Prepare to remove and reset BMPs
 - Don't let wash water from tools enter storm water collection systems
 - Litter control and good housekeeping
